
## Paradise Blvd Drainage Pond - 16 Apr 2024 PROPOSED PLAN

- Met with Lisa Good (City Engrg Dept-Compliance) and James Ennis (City Engineer) on 16 Apr 2024 for approx. 1 hr
  - 1) Allowing us time to develop remediation plan and associated quotes/contractor selection for work to be done.
  - 2) Vegetation: NOT requiring removal of ALL vegetation. Must REMOVE ALL "Invasive Species" (Brazilian pepper trees, carrotwood trees), Schefflera trees, cattails, water borne grasses. Can reduce remaining bank growth to a height of not less than 9 inches above ground. Retain existing oak trees (so long as they are not near inflow lines, which were mapped by City Engineer), palm trees and sea grape trees.
  - 3) **Exposed soil** After vegetation removal, any areas of exposed soil to be planted with bahia grass.
  - 4) Concrete weir: Remove ALL weed growth, put misplaced blocks back into place and install new concrete bags to original level as needed.
  - 5) Damaged Drainage Pipe: IF SOLITUDE can certify in writing that water flow is clear thru all 3 pipes, then no repair needed to damaged collar.
  - 6) Melbourne City Code Was provided a hard copy of referenced and applicable City Code.

#### Banks Growth.

Do not eliminate. Keep height to between 9

 18 inches to prevent soil erosion.

Damaged 24-in drain pipe.

 No need to repair if clear flow thru of water thru all 3 pipes is verified in writing by Solitude







### Weir

- Remove all loose concrete blocks from water and put back in place.
  - Add new bags of cement as needed to level of existing and intact weir blocks
